

Attachment B - WIOA Income Guidelines

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Policies and Procedures

POLICY #W401 Effective Date: March 1st, 2016

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) identifies income standards used when determining income status for reporting, eligibility, and priority of service for various WIOA-funded programs. Determining income status in most instances must take into consideration family size and includable/excludable income (as defined in SAWDC Eligibility Policy Handbook Section 5.6.3 and Section 8 respectively).

This policy does not apply to those who qualify as low-income based on receipt of public assistance, homelessness, free or reduced price lunch, or foster care.

This policy establishes the income standards for:

- Low-income an individual who is in a family with a total family income that does not exceed the low-income standard below. (Federal Register HHS Poverty Guidelines 1/22/2015; Federal Register WIOA LLSIL 3/27/2015; WIOA LLSISL Correction 7/16/2015)
- WIOA Adult 4th Priority an individual with a barrier to employment who's in a family with a total family income that does not exceed 175% of DHHS poverty guidelines below. (Federal Register HHS Poverty Guidelines 1/22/2015)
